State Will Pay \$1.8 Million to Man Injured in Crash of Passenger Van

New Jersey has agreed to pay \$1.8 million to a man injured while a passenger in a state vehicle.

On May 9, 2006, Juan Molina, 17, of Elizabeth, was returning from a fishing outing for people with disabilities when the van's driver lost control on the Garden State Parkway in Clifton, causing the van to plummet down an embankment.

Molina was thrown from the vehicle and suffered a cervical fracture dislocation that required fusion, a lumbar fracture and brain injuries that worsened his cognitive abilities, says his lawyer, Todd Leonard of Leonard & Leonard in Morristown.

Leonard, assisted in the case by

partner Alvin Leonard, says a police investigation blamed driver error for the crash.

Under the Dec. 11 stipulation of settlement filed in Passaic County, the plaintiff's mother, Carmen Echevarria, received \$150,000 of the total on her per quod claim in the case, Molina v. State of New Jersey.

Leonard says the defense stipulated to liability but that Deputy Attorney General Alfred Low-Beer obtained an expert opinion that the plaintiff made an excellent recovery and that the accident did not cause further cognitive defects.

Leland Moore, a spokesman for the state Attorney General's Office, says the settlement was a fair and reasonable outcome.
